Clothing & Personal Protective Equipment



Shoes

It is recommended that approved safety shoes be worn to protect your feet.



Hard Hats

Hard hats shall be worn in all designated areas and construction areas.



Eye Protection

Proper eye protection must be worn when the nature of the operation presents a potential eye or face Examples of these hazards include: Flying objects, dust, hot or splashing metals, harmful rays, acids, or caustics.



Gloves

Appropriate gloves and aprons shall be worn when handling hazardous chemicals and abrasive materials. Gloves should be replaced when the signs of wear are apparent.



Respiratory

Approved respiratory equipment shall be worn when the worker is exposed to toxic chemicals, dusts, spray painting, or other inhalation hazards.



Jewelry

The wearing of rings or other jewelry is not recommended on the job, particularly if working around moving or rotating parts.



Safety equipment available must be readily available with replacements on hand.
