	<p>Shoes It is recommended that approved safety shoes be worn to protect your feet.</p>
	<p>Hard Hats Hard hats shall be worn in all designated areas and construction areas.</p>
	<p>Eye Protection Proper eye protection must be worn when the nature of the operation presents a potential eye or face hazard. Examples of these hazards include: Flying objects, dust, hot or splashing metals, harmful rays, acids, or caustics.</p>
	<p>Gloves Appropriate gloves and aprons shall be worn when handling hazardous chemicals and abrasive materials. Gloves should be replaced when the signs of wear are apparent.</p>
	<p>Respiratory Approved respiratory equipment shall be worn when the worker is exposed to toxic chemicals, dusts, spray painting, or other inhalation hazards.</p>
	<p>Jewelry The wearing of rings or other jewelry is not recommended on the job, particularly if working around moving or rotating parts.</p>
	<p>Safety equipment available must be readily available with replacements on hand.</p>
